Knowing the basics and having a plan will make conversation with coaches easier and allow you to simply be yourself.

Know	the program basics:
	Division and level
	Conference
	Recent track record (Wins/Losses)
	Rival schools or conference foes
	Coaching staff history (How long have coaches been there? Have they had success? Where did they coach before? What is the reputation?)
	Successful alums
	Some program history
Know	the basics about the school:
	Correct name
	Size
	Brief history
	What is it known for?
	the role of your parent/support person in advance: What is your game plan? Discuss appropriate role of parent/support person in advance Have support person come with questions prepared Support person as important listener, you as the main voice
Show	up prepared:
	Bring updated copies of your transcript and test scores
	Have a goal for the visit in mind (get information, get offer, learn more, make a commitment, etc.)
Prepar	e questions:
	What do you want to know? (Coaching and training philosophies, opportunity to play, roster questions, daily schedule questions, academic support resources, etc.)
	What do you need to know? (Cost of attendance, level of interest, etc.)
	Write questions down so you don't forget in the moment
Remin	d yourself of appropriate day-of-visit behavior:
	Wear nice, clean set of clothes
	Address the coaches more formally ("yes sir", "yes coach" until established otherwise)
	Phone on silent and away for entire visit
	Speak and answer for yourself (don't defer to parents)
	Be present in the moment and be engaged
	Re honest and he the hest version of yourself
